

In the Name of God Amen This Twentieth eight of June
1775. I William Talbot of Norfolk County being Sick
and weak of Body, but of sound Mind and Memory (thanks
be to God) do ordain and make this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following. That is to say -

Inprimis I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Talbot the South
-east part or partment of the Land and Plantation where
-on I now live, the South East part of the Land bought
of Francis Wishart dec^d included, I give the same to

him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Talbot all the North East part or partment of the Land and Plantation whereon I now live, the North East part of the Land Tract of Francis Wishart dec^d included, and the whole of broad Neck included, as also the North East part of the Lands that was ~~of~~ ^{of} Father's included, I give ~~the same to him~~ and his heirs forever. The Line or rather bounds of division between the Lands I have given my Son Richard, and the Lands I have given to my Son William are a Line or bounds which I marked myself quite across all my Lands in the Presence of John Reed, and my Son Mark; the bounds begin at an old pine binding on John Triggs Land and so proceeds by several marked Trees, ~~then~~ ^{then} quite across ^{all} my Land (though not quite straight) to a dead, broken topped red Oak joining and binding on the Land that was Nat. Boush's (now supposed to be Charles. S. Boush's).

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard the Hand Mill

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard the Hand Mill that was my Father's I give the same unto him and his Heirs forever; but reserve the use of the said Mill to my loving Wife during her Natural Life.

Item I give unto my Son William Talbot the Hand Mill that is in the Quarter to him and his Heirs forever; but reserve the use of said Mill to my Wife during her natural Life.

Item I give unto my Son William Talbot one Negro Boy named Peter to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Dianna Talbot one Negro Girl named Vilot, one negro girl named Philis to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daug^r Elizabeth Talbot one Negro Girl named Lettice, one negro girl named Bejs, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Son Mark Talbot all the Land and

Plantation whereon he now lives, it being the whole of
Lands that I bought of John Guy and Jonathan Lang-
ley, I give the whole of them to him and his Heirs forever.
Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Williamson one Negro
Girl named Tiller, to her and her Heirs forever. also one
Negro Boy named Lewis, to her and her Heirs forever.
Item I give unto my Daughter Locky Guy one Negro Girl
named Alice, and one Negro Boy named James, to her and her
Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Dixon the choice of
one horse and calf, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my loving Wife Mary Talbot, the following Ne-
gros, Marmoth, Cuffe, David, Frank and Pleasant, and
Chain during her natural Life, and after my Wife's dec.
the said Negros to be equally divided among all my
children that is a Line at that time, to them and their
Heirs forever.

The said Negroes to be equally divided among all my children that is a line at that time, to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item I give unto my loving Wife Mary Talbot, all the Stock of all kind, viz. Horses, cattle, Sheep, Hogs, also all the Furniture within and without doors of all kinds during her natural Life, and after her dec. the said Stock and Furniture to be equally divided among all my children that is a line at that time, to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item I give unto my Wife one Negro Woman named Haggie during her natural Life, and the said Negro Woman Haggie to be equally divided among the rest of the above mentioned Negroes, Murreth, Luffe, David, Frank, Pleasant, & Chain to be equally divided among all my children, that is alive at that Time, after my Wife's dec. to them and their Heirs for ever.

Lastly I do appoint my loving Wife Mary Talbot,
and my son Richard Talbot Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, I do ^{and} revoke, disannul all former
Wills, Legacies by me in any ways made Willed be-
-queathed and do satisfy allow, and confirm this and
no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Wit-
-ness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
affixed my Seal. The Day and year first above written.
