the said Will & the name thereunto subscribed are all of the Testator's proper hand
writing whereupon on the motion of Thomas Tatum made oath thereto and
gave bond & security according to Law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
letters of administration on the said decedent's estate with his will annexed in a
