tory life do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following. I Give and Bequeath to my loving
Wife all the Corn and Meat and Fat that, that is on the Plantation
and ⁱⁿ the best Cattle for her present Use, I lend to my Wife Martha
Wallace one Negro Wench named Mill during her Widowhood, Likewise
I Give to my loving Wife, one third of the Cattle Hogs and Moveable
Estate during her Widowhood and if she marries only a Childs Part
of that, and I give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Martha Wallace
One Negro Girl named Hannah, and I Give and Bequeath to my loving
Son David Wallace One Negro Girl named Sarah and all the Rest of my
Estate to be Equally divided amongst my Children, that is hereafter
named Judith Hobgood, and Hannah Ellet, and Tabitha Wallace, and Leda
Wallace, and Martha Wallace, and David Wallace, and if Martha Wallace
dieth without an Heir of her body that same Negro to be sold and the Money
to be equally divided among all the Rest of my Children and that same

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Wife all the Corn and Meat and Fat that, that is on the Plantation

Wallace one Negro Wench named Mill during her Widowhood, Likewise

Wallace, and Martha Wallace, and David Wallace, and if Martha Wallace
dieth without an Heir of her Body that same Negro to be sold and the Money
to be equally divided among all the Rest of my Children and that same
Negro Mill that I lent to my loving Wife, If she dieth before my loving

son David Wallace then the Negro to Return to my Son Joe Wallace
I have herunto put my Hand and Seal this 24th Day of March 1768.
