belonging to it (being One Hundred and Twenty Nine Acres more or

life to him and his heirs forever after my Wifes Decease not
Disavowing of any Privilege of the said Land and I likewise
make constitute and Appoint my Dearly beloved Wife to be my
Whole and Sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament
