Item I give & bequeath unto my grandson Richard Warden
one hundred & twenty five Acres Land & Marsh to the
more or less being the Plantation that Rachel West
formerly lived on but If he should die without heirs
lawfully begotten of his body then I should
fall to his two Sisters to be Equally divided between
them both to them & their heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Carter
the Plantation she formerly lived on containing one
hundred Acres of Land to her & her heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughters Sally & Abel Warden
one hundred & twenty five Acres of Land more or
or less down North West River being the Plantation
whereon Silas West now lives to them & their heirs for
ever also I give them each a bed & furniture.

Item I give & bequeath to my two Daughters Lydia Poyner
& Nancy Warden a parcel of Land containing one
Hundred and Twenty five Acres of Land more or
less it being always known by the name of the
Plank House also I give a piece joining to it called the
name of Ball's Point to the North of it.
