of the County of Norfolk being of good Health &c do  
make this my last will and Testament

I give and devise to my daughter Abi Corrow the  
Wife of Samuel Corrow one negro man named Simon  
to her and her heirs for Ever

I give and devise to my daughter Leticia Warrinton the  
Wife of Samuel Warrinton one negro woman named Sarah  
to her and her heirs for Ever

and likewise one feather Bed and one Truss and one  
Blankett and one sheet

I Give and devise to my grandson William Warrinton  
after the decease of his father Abram Warrinton  
The westward End of my plantation which I now live on  
By Estimation of one Hundred and thirty five Acres  
more or less beginning at a point on the line of  
Silvesters line thence running a Due north Course  
a Crook the plantation to John Warringtons line  
and like wise I give to my Grandson Wm. Warrinton  
after the Decease of his father a piece of Land near  
the great Bridge which my father bought of Richard  
William Silvester beginning at a stone on water south  
line thence running fifty feet along the Road  
and like wise running down to the Swamp  
to him and his heirs for Ever

I give and devise to my son Abram Warrington one  
Negro man named Dick and one feather Bed one Truss  
and one sheet

Item I give and devise to my son Samuel Worthington the Eastern part of my plantation formerly where my father lived by Estimation of one hundred acres more or less and likewise a piece of land <sup>in the bridge</sup> adjoining to Robert Withins running fifty feet from Robert Withins line upwards and like wise fifty acres of land that I bought of Benjamin Trill adjoining to William Williams formerly called Whites old field to him and his heirs for ever and like wise one feather bed and one rug and one blanket and one sheet and one gun called the new gun and likewise one negro girl named Kitt to him &c

Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Mary Worthington one negro boy named Jack and one bay Dog and my Devise is that all the Rest of my things within Doors and out Doors that is not already Given to be Equally Divided between Alice Corrocor and Leticia Weston and between Worthington and Samuel Worthington

And lastly hereby make nominate and appoint my son Samuel Worthington & Richard Silvester Executors and Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this 7 day of February 1762
