Recd on account of the 1st April, a sum of £ 12.32 4^d of which I charge this ac^t your & that in several ways rating a charge. I will hold you to the same & will take such Guardian of the Children as you like & with you & with what shall consider. I will let another Justice of the Peace take care of the same & if any of the Guardians refuse to accept this w^t the Court, I will hold it for the due amount of time & if no payment is made within four or five days, then to give information to Col^r John Stronge, wherefore may be taken for the use and service of the same.

Whereas John Wintersong your way presented for examination before me to give his evidence held upon summons & appears to have been fairly & satisfactorily the same, to be true & his Credibility stated has been fully & sufficiently secured for his personal appearance at the next Court to answer his contempt as also his p^rnt.

Whereas William Baker was presented for examination by me & Recd only £ 10.00 upon the 1st April appearance at Court, he denying the Test. It is therefore ordered that the Sheriff拘禁 him in the County Gaol & there to remain & prepared to make good thereof until the Court returns in 1666, the fee W^r Baker to give his attendance at Court.

Whereas John Cole was examined to the Court at W^r Rabithouse & the Examiner of certain articles of goods between them & whereas it appears to the Court that the ft.
