I give and bequeath to my Young Daughter Susannah Drown one large Copper  
Kettle and one new Feather Bed and one new Ring and Furniture and one Sea Kettle  
and Six new leather chairs half the fourth part of the Cattle here and at Wauwomon  
to her and her heirs for ever. I Give and bequeath to my Young Son Brown  
Drown the eighth part of all the Cattle here and at Wauwomon and the fourth part of
