Item. I give and bequeath to my Son Peter Bowdoin, when he shall marry
and have Issue, or attain the Age of Twenty-one Years, the following Negro Slaves
Cato, Daniel the younger, Sarah, daughter of Cato, Pleasant, Minney, Plum and new
Sarah to him, and his Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Son —

Item. I give and bequeath to my Son John Bowdoin, when he shall marry and have issue, or attain the age of Twenty one years the following Negro Slaves, vizt. Item. I give and bequeath to my Son Peter Bowdoin, when he shall marry and have issue, or attain the age of Twenty one years the following Negro Slave, vizt. Cato, Daniel the younger, Sarah, daughter of Cato, Pleasant, Mammey, Nannie and new Sarah to him, and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Son James Bowdoin, when he shall marry and have issue, or attain to the age of Twenty one years the following Negro Slave, vizt. yellow Stephen, Ruben, James, bought of Durston, Priscilla, Nannie and Liza to him and his heirs forever, also five hundred pounds ^{current} money.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Bowdoin, when she shall marry, attain the age of Twenty one Years, One Negro Slave named Bess, to her and her Heirs forever; and also One thousand Pounds Current-money.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Bowdoin, when she shall marry or attain the age of Twenty one Years, one Negro Slave named Hannah to her and her heirs forever; and also one thousand pounds Current-money.

also one thousand, ~~and~~ one thousand pounds Current money.

Item. I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Grace Bourdoin, the following Negro Slaves vizt; Sarah, (bought of Fazwell) Luke, & bought of Stotely, Jenny and her child to her and her Heirs forever; and also my Chariot, or Port Chair, which is now expected in from England, her Choice of two of my Horses, and one thousand Pound in money, in View of her Right of Dower in my Estate.

Item, my will and desire is that my Executors sell for the use of my Estate the following Slaves (viz^e), so that I bought of Savage Cowdry, out of Willm^m Wedgwood's Estate, James bought out of Henry Warrens Estate, and Mary.

I give the residue of my Estate to be among my loving wife Grace, my Sons John, Peter and James, and my Daughters Elizabeth, Margaret, Mary, Sarah, each of Sons to have a Double Share, with each of my Daughters, and my wife.

Item In Case my Estate be not sufficient to pay the Legacies before given, Then and -
in that Case each of my three Sons to lose of said Deficiency with each of my Daughters, and
wife a Double share.

Item. In case of the Death of one or more of Children, before they may, or attain the age of Twenty one years, Then I give his her or their parts of what money I have before given them, to be divided among the surviving Children, the Son or Sons to have a Double Share with each of my Daughters.

Item. My Will and Desire is, That as soon as a Settlement shall be made of my Estate, that, my Childrens and Wifes money be ^{let} out at Interest, in Common for their Support, as... also the Profits of the Plantations, Slaves, and Rents of the Houses at the Court house and Hungars Bridge: and if any Profits arise from the Intrest, Rents &c over and above the maintenance of my said Wife and Children, when my Son John arrives, he

at lawful Age, or either of my Children or Wife marries, that the said Esq; be Divided among
my Children, each of my Sons to have a double part with each of my Daughters.

Item. It is my Will and Desire that my loving Wife live and continue with my Children in the House I now dwell in, untill she, or either of my Daughters marry, or my son John arrive at Lawful Age.

Item. I will and ordain that if in Case either of my Sons die before they
marry, and have Issue, or attain the Age of Twenty one Years, by which mean
the Lands to him devised could not rest in him, but would descend to the Su-
rviving elder Brother, then and in that Case it is my will that the surviving
elder Brother, pay to the surviving younger Brother the Sum of Seven Hundred
and fifty Pounds Current money; but if he refuse so to do, Then I give and be-
queath the Lands devised ^{to the} Brother dying as aforesaid to his surviving younger
Brother, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. It is my Will that in Case one of my Sons die as aforesaid, and then
a second Son die before he shall marry or have Issue, or attain the Age of Twenty-

Item. I give the Tuition of my Daughters to my loving Wife, so long as she remains
lives my widow, or until they marry, or arrive at lawful Age, which ever shall first
happen, and the Tuition of my Sons to my Executors; and when ever my Wife
marries, then I give the Tuition of all my Children to my Executors. And it is my
particular desire that my Brother Preston Bowdoin see to and take care of the
Education of my Sons, and that they be sent to such Schools, as he shall think
fit; and that when their Education at School is finished, that he bind them out
to Merchants, or any other Business he shall think proper; And in Case of his death

Then I desire, my other surviving Executors may see that this my last Will and Testament be performed in every respect.

Item. My will and desire is, That the burying place where my Family is buried at my Sea-side Plantation be inclosed with a Brick-wall, and the charge paid out of my Estate, and that my Executors see that the same be done.

Item. I give and bequeath to each of my Execs hereafter named, a neat mourning Ring, the charge to be paid out of my Estate.

Lastly. I nominate and appoint my brother Preson Bowdoin, and my friends Isaac Smith, and Phonowgood Smith ^{my Executors to} Executors to this my last will and Testament, revoking all other Wills, heretofore made, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.
