In the name of God amen, I, John Kendall Junr<sup>r</sup> of Northampton County in Virginia being weak and low in body, but sound in mind do make and ordain this my last will and testament bearing date the Nineteenth day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety three, Just may soul to God, through the merits of a blessed saviour, and as to what worldly possessions it hath pleased God, to bestow on me, I would wish all such should be disposed of in manner and form as followeth.  
 Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my son John Kendall the

the plantation on sea-side purchased of Mr. Henry Guy, containing three hundred and eight acres be, <sup>the same</sup> more or less, also twenty acres more beginning at the sea-side County road, running parallel to the south line of said Estate, and to continue to the marsh, to him and his heirs forever, and if in case my said son John, should be under age, and without issue living that his land devised to him, by this will, shall go to my son Custis, and for him the said Custis, to pay to his sister Elizabeth, and Henry Kendall one hundred pounds specie each.

Item, I give and bequeath, my stony branch plantation in the following manner, by a divisional line, running Eastwardly and westwardly and by an equal division of acres between my daughter Elizabeth Bordoin Kendall, and my son Custis - Kendall granting the first choice to my said daughter Elizabeth, to them and their heirs forever, and if in case of either death, before such division, the survivor shall take the other moiety, and if in case of both their deaths under age and without issue living, - then for my son Henry Kendall to take the whole of said plantation, and for him to resign to his brother John Kendall, such lands, as I may hereafter allot my said son Henry.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Kendall two hundred acres of land, formerly the property of John S. Hanson - anson (a part of which is at this time under mortgage, but the right purchased by me) of Mr. John Eyre, to him the said Henry Kendall and to his heirs forever, and at the time of my

Item, I desire that all such of my Crop, or Crops and what ever else that has not as yet, been mentioned in this will, and the half of a Schooner, so far as may be necessary for the payment of my just debts, together with what cash, may be due me, — also if it should be necessary the following Names, Abigail, Lucy, Betsey and youngest Child, — and if that should not do, then, &c.

Item, I grant unto my affectionate wife Lucretia Kendall, after my decease to settle on the plantation, allotted my for my son John including also the lands purchased of John J. Warmanson until my said son John arrives to the lawful age

of Twenty one years, and that she shall be intitled to the profits of the same, to bring up, support and educate all my children, and that the slaves belonging to the said Estate, to continue on the same, also four cows, and calves, and one Bull, also ten choicest Cows, and a Ram, and all the stock of Hogs, and sixty barrels of long corn, or hundred and fifty Bushels of Oats, Seventy five Bushels of clean wheat, and Ten Bushels of Pease, and four hundred sheaves of Flax, one yoke of Oxen first choice, Two work Horses first choice, and a Horse by the name of buck, to support the said family and stock for one year, provided she remains my widow, — until my said son John arrives to lawful age, But in case she should marry, and become the right of another man in such case, she must be put to her dowry, and that a division of my personal Estate, at the time of my said John, coming to age, shall take place, between my said wife, and all my Children, by an equal division to <sup>them & to</sup> their Heirs forever.

I Item. 
