In the Name of God amen, I William Simkins of the County of Northampton and State of Virginia being in the decline of life, but of sound mind memory and understanding. On consideration the uncertainty of this transitory life. do make and publish this my last will and Testament. In manner and form as follows. Viz: I desire that my body may be decently buried at the discretion of my executors and I commend my soul to God who gave it me in hopes of a happy resurrection to a blessed Immortality.

Item having already provided for my dear Children Peggy Evans, Coventon Simkins William Simkins and Sarah Brown I give them nothing of my present Estate.

Item I give to the Children of my daughter Peggy Evans one hundred pounds to be equally divided among them.

Item I give to my son Nathaniel Simkins five of my negroes namely Stephen, Ben, Elijah, Sam, and George, to serve him until they arrive to the age of forty years and then to be free forever.

Item I desire that all the remaining part of my Estate, my Land negroes Stock, household Furniture, Cash and every thing that I am possessed of may be equally divided between my loving wife Ann Simkins and my Children Arthur Simkins, John Simkins, Isaac Simkins, Charles Simkins, Nathaniel Simkins, Sally Simkins, and Polly Simkins.

Item I desire that my land may be sold and the money equally divided among my wife and her children or if my executors choose that it may be valued and they themselves accountable to my children for their equal parts of the yearly rents until my daughter Polly Simkins arrives to the age of fifteen years, and then sold and the money equally divided.

Item I desire that if one of my children should die under age or before he or she is maned that his or her part of my Estate may be equally divided among the rest.

Item I desire that all my negroes that I am possessed of who have

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have arrived to the age of Forty years may be given at my death, and that all the rest may be given as they arrive to that age, they and their posterity forever, ~~contained in the other~~  
Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Ann Simkins and my three sons Arthur Simkins, John Simkins and Isaac Simkins to be my sole executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and Ninety three. ~




