In the name of God Amen I George Not of the County
of Northumberland in England being overcome of body
but of sound & perfect memory for which I praise
Almighty God knowing the certainty of death the
time & hours uncertaine doe therefore make & declare
that my last Will & Testament I give & command
my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through
the merits of Jesus Christ to receive remission of all my
sins next I commit my body to the earth from whence it
came And as touching such estate as I have endowd me
withall I doe bequeath thereof as followeth Vizt
First I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth
Not one house called by the name of White Gate and one
hundred acres of land out of the Hundred of North
upon Perromote River and that to be where I now live
with all housing thereto belonging
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Sonne George
Not one house called Motley and one hundred Acres of
land next adjoining unto the land of my wife Elizabeth
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Sonne John Not
one hundred acres of land next adjoining unto the land
of my wife Elizabeth Not
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Sonne William
Not one house called Motley and also the first Cow
calf that falls from the Cow called Motley given to my
loving George Not and one hundred acres of land next
adjoining unto Francis Howells
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Daughter
Ann Not one great brass Kettle
Item I give & bequeath unto my Sonne George Not
my long gun and to my Son John Not my mustell
Item I give & bequeath unto Henry Lenton the Sonne
of my Son Lenton my short gun
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Brother George
Not one Cow calf
Item I give and bequeath unto Thomas Hall (hee to be bound
by indenture or by order of Court) one Cow calf to be
delivered for the three years before the expiration of his
freedom All the rest & residue of my Estate whatsoever
my debts & legacies being paid I give & bequeath unto
my loving wife Elizabeth Not whom I doe make my sole
and entire executrix of this my last Will & Testament
I do give & bequeath what power & ordainance
this to stand for as my last Will & Testament In
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seale
the 18th of November 1655. The marks of George Not
sealed & delivered by the above named George Not for and
as his last Will & Testament in the presence of the marks
of 8th Justice R^r P^rys
2th March 1655. this Will was proved in open Court
by the oath of R^r P^rys
