To all to whom these presents shall come I William Berkeley Esq  
Governor & Capt. Generall of Virginia send greeting in our Lord God  
overruling Whome by Instructions from his Right most excellent  
Maj<sup>ty</sup> directed to me and the Council of State his Ma<sup>ty</sup> was graciously  
pleased to authorize me the said Council & his Ma<sup>ty</sup> soverell to grant  
grants & assigne such portions of land to all adventurers and  
planters at hand some before heretofore or yet like may differ  
for avancement of money or transportation of people into this Colonie  
according to a charter of Priviledges from the King bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> day  
of May 1609 the first purport whereof is That he his heirs & assigns  
shall have the sole privilege of sending over Sea persons to inhabit  
in this Colonie & also of the carrying over that hath been transported  
Richard Smith M<sup>r</sup> James who that the same might be continued  
to all Adventurers & planters until it shall otherwise be determined  
by his Ma<sup>ty</sup> His heirs & assigns & the said Sir Wm Berkeley &  
I do with the consent of the Council of State accordingly give & grant  
unto John Gamlin Esquire one hundred five acres & fifty shotes of  
land lying between the James River & the York River being at a marked  
Whelping place called the Old field of a Brooke commonly  
called the Old field of the James River which said tract of  
the same land is bounded on the North side of the said James River  
and the said tract of land from the head of John Donnell  
from the said James River to another marked Gun hole is  
near thirty to a marked water spring on the Western side of the  
head of the said Brooke is to give unto him self & his  
heirs & assigns & his heirs & assigns forever the full power  
full power & authority by for the time being

went into the Colony at whose name are recorded manors and the  
 wanted to have and to hold the said land with his heirs of all and  
 c. mutually thence contained with all woods waters & tithes with all  
 profits & emolument & hereditaries whatsoever in any wise belonging to  
 the said land to them the said Gamlin & Wooster their heirs & assigns

 by his Majesty's said instructions at all by Act of Assembly of the

 or estate to be granted or stated upon the said land within three  
 years next ensuing that then it may & shall lawfully for any  
 adventure or plantation to make choice of lands thereupon given  
 at James City under my hand & the Seal of the Colony the  
 3 day of April 1642 William Berkeley  
 Know all men by these words that John Gamlin & for  
 my special Execution & Administration for a valuable consideration  
 I have sold & conveyed & sold over into Thomas Brown and  
 Wooster his heirs & assigns & Administrators & assigns all  
 right title & interest of this Patent for ever. Witness my hand  
 this 27<sup>th</sup> of May 1642 the mark of John Gamlin Witness

 Know all men by these words that I Isaac Wooster for a valuable
