ordain this my last will in manner & form following (viz)

I implore you that all my just debts be paid from I will that all my Estate
be kept together by my Executors hereafter mentioned for the Support of
myself the Ruxy during his life or widowhood as also for the Support of his
Daughter Lucy Pitts Ruxy who it is my desire should be also Educated out
of the Details of my Estate by my Executors after the Death of Lucy Pitts Ruxy

Should arrive to lawfull age or marriage Age and Bequeath to her the
following Legacies (viz) George Pitts Lucy Saria & their future Increase
which said Negroes I give to her & her heirs forever I also give unto Lucy
Pitts Ruxy one feather bed & furniture One horse of twenty pounds weight

A Saddle & Bridle also four Cows & Calves all which I give to her & her
heirs forever I wish that all the Residue of my Estate be to her in whatsoever
kind or quantity sever not already Divided should at the Death or

marriage of Elizabeth Ruxy be Equally divided between my three Children (viz)

marriage of Elizabeth Rengy be Equally divided between my three children (viz)

Richard Beestley William Beestley & Anne Beestley which I give to
them & their heirs forever I will if Lucy Pitts Rengy Should die before

she arrives to Langfitt age 20 years that in that case what I have given
her shall be Equally divided between my three children Richard Beestley

William Beestley & Anne Beestley at the death or marriage of Eliza-
beth Rengy which I give to them and their heirs forever if she dies

that nothing herein contained be misconstrued for want of precision
form in law & I do hereby constitute & appoint my Friends James Cook
