I Andrew Redford of the County of Methuen being sick and weak of
of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
as followeth, I have given or lent unto my loving wife Mary Redford during
her natural life all the Estate I possess both real and personal, subject only to
the maintenance of my daughter Martha Redford, whom it is my desire
shall be supported from my estate so long as she continues single and no longer.
It is my Will and desire that my estate given or lent my loving wife during
her life be at her decease equally divided among my three sons Edward
Redford, Sewell Redford and John Redford, the lands according to quan-
-tity and quality, to them and their heirs ^{or assigns} forever if they cannot agree among
themselves in the division any two or more persons they shall appoint for
that purpose shall be as effectual as a decree of court would be.
And Lastly, I do hereby appoint my three sons Edward Redford, Sewell
-ing Redford and John Redford Executors of this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking and annulling all former Wills heretofore made,
unto which I have set my hand and seal this 10th December 1807
