 Perry Gamble and her Increase to dispose of as her own proper use as she thinks
 fit. among her Children I also leave the use of my plantation whereon I now
 live containing two hundred and twenty five Acres of Land with the Stock of all kinds
 with the use of the following Negroes Vizt. Bobb, Jack, man, Clee, Pompey, Abram
 as also the household and kitchen furniture, to give to her Children at her
 discretion &c

Item I give and devise unto my beloved son George Annally one Guinea calf and one Guinea to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and devise unto my beloved Daughter Tabitha Jackson one negro Woman named Sarah and her Increase and one negro boy Tom and my desire is that my Grandson Charles Jackson when He comes to the years of Seven to be put to school and if he takes learning will to have two year schooling the money to be paid out of my Estate to pay for it I have given it before this considerable for his portion

Item - I give and devise unto my beloved son John Annally one negro woman named Ned, and a negro boy named young Ned, and a negro girl named Lilly or Melly having given him before this considerably for his portion

Item I give and devise unto my beloved son Charles Annally one horse and calf and one Guinea to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and devise unto my beloved Daughter Anne Annally one negro woman named Trip with her two Children and their Increase named Dick and Flore, also one bed and furniture one great Trunk one side Saddle and one young mare, and some stock as it can be spared at the discretion of her Mother or Executor for her portion

Item I give and devise unto my youngest Daughter Catherine Annally one negro

named Sarah and her Increase and one negro boy Tom and my desire is that my
Grandson Charles Jackson when he comes to the years of Seven to be put to school
and if he takes learning well to have two year schooling the money to be raised
out of my Estate to pay for it I have given her before this considerable for her
portion

Item - I give and devise unto my beloved son John Connally one negro man
named Ned, and a negro boy named young Ned, and a negro girl named
Lilly or Prilly having given him before this confidentially for his portion

Item - I give and devise unto my beloved son Charles Connally one cow and half and one
gum to him and his heirs forever

Item - I give and devise unto my beloved Daughter Anne Connally one negro woman named
Torp with her two children and their Increase named Lido and Shore, also one bed and
furniture one great Trunk one side Saddle and one young mare, and some
stock as I can be spared at the discretion of her Mother or Executor for her
portion

Item - I give and devise unto my youngest Daughter Catherine Connally one negro
girl named Alice with all her Increase and a negro man named Abraham
one bed and furniture one side Saddle and the young man called
James one Trunk or Chest and some stock or household furniture as can be
spared at the discretion of my wife or Executor & to be accountable in part of
her portion

Item I give and devise unto my beloved son Melkison bonnally the plantation
whereon I now live containing two hundred and twenty five Acres of Land after
my wife Dorease and a young negro man named Mungo (or Bullwood) also a negro girl
named Angel better with her Increase and one bed and furniture also some
books and my team and Rags, to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and Devise unto my beloved son Thomas bonnally one hundred and
thirty Acres of Land Called Robertson lying the Old Road, may line
Bentleys line George Conrallys line up Harrys branch to the Old Road only
my hands is to work there I will more land is purchased and negro by name
Peter one named Summey also one feather bed and furniture some
Stock as can be spared to him and his heirs forever

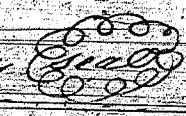
Item I give and Devise unto my beloved son Melkison bonnally one negro by name
Shamel also one negro girl named Nancy (also called born) and her Increase
a bed and furniture to be taken out of my Estate one horse Coll saddle and
bridle to him and his heirs &c

Item My Desire is that the five negroes Bob, Jack, man, Pompey and blue be
kept together till my wife Dorease and then be Equally Divided between
all my children that shall be alive then my desire is yt Bob shall
chose one of the children to live with &c

Item I give and devise unto my beloved son Melhison Connally one negro boy named
Samuel also one negro girl named Nancy (both children) and her furniture
a bed and furniture to be raised out of my Estate one horse Coll saddle and
bridle to him and his heirs &c

Item My Desire is that the five negroes Bob, Jack, Sam, Pompey and blue be
kept together till my wifes Decease and then to Equally Divided between
all my children that shall be alive then my desire is yt Bob, shall
chose w^{ch} of the children to live with &c

Item I last of all Appoint William Fitzgerald Judge Connally & his Wm Connally
to be my sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and any other
will by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal 13th Day of June 1795
