

In the name of God Amen The 31 day of July 1790

I John Bartholomew Dupuy of Newbury County being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory thank's be to God for the same, and calling unto mind the uncertainty of this Transitory life, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following That

I Will that all my just debts be paid, and that my Estate be not appraised by order of Court. I Give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Dupuy during her Natural life, my land and plantation whereon I now live it being the same which I purchased of John Gossant, also one featherbed and furniture (called the little Trunk-bed a pair of best wheels, a small Dutch oven and one yoke of Oxen (two thirds of the value of said Oxen to be returned to my Estate)

I Give and bequeath to my aforesaid Wife, the Household furniture and Stock to the value of those she was possessed with at Marriage (it being in lieu of the same) My Will is that my said wife have a reasonable maintenance in provision for herself, negroes and stock till she can make a trip, provided that she should have no right to the same by Law and will finally give up and acquit her right to Twenty five Barrels of corn which came by her

I have given and delivered in possession to my Daughter Magdalene D'Athens her heirs and assigns sundry Negroes &c as his full proportion of my Estate.

I have given and delivered in possession to my son John Dupuy his Heirs and assigns, Sundry Negroes &c. I also give and bequeath to my said son John his Heirs & assigns, the Land and plantation whereon he now lives.

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Item I have given and delivered in possession to my son James Dupuy his Heirs and Assigns, sundry Negroes, the Land whereon he now lives &c. I also give and bequeath to my said son James his Heirs and Assigns, my Negro man named Ben also my Still, reserving as much of the use of the said Still for my wife as will distill as much Liquor annually as will be sufficient for her family use.

Item I have given and delivered in possession to my son Peter Dupuy his Heirs and Assigns sundry Negroes &c. I also give and bequeath unto my said son Peter his Heirs and Assigns, the Land and plantation whereon he now lives, including the lands my Father bequeathed to me, and also all that I purchased of William Walton and also one negro named Beck and her future Increase and after the Death of my Wife, I give and bequeath to my said son Peter his Heirs and Assigns all my lands which I have lent her. I also give to my son Peter one negro woman named Bobb.

Item I will that all the residue of my Estate be it in what ever kind or quality soever not heretofore given or lent be divided between my two sons named John and James their Heirs and Assigns in the following manner or Manner: My son John his Heirs &c. to have two thirds of the same, and my son James his Heirs &c. to have one third and after my wife I will that whatever I have lent to her except the Land, be divided in the same manner and form as above, between my aforesaid sons John and James their Heirs and Assigns.

Item I will what nothing herein contained be misconstrued, for want of term or form in Law, and I do hereby constitute and appoint my John James and Peter Executors of this my
