

In the name of God Amen I John Stark of the County of Nottingham do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner following (Wit) I Impower I lend to my loving wife during her widowhood the land and Plantation wherein I live with three negroes to wit, with Lizzie and Ell with the future increase of Lizzie and Ell, three feather beds, bedsteads and furniture household and kitchen furniture Plantation tools of every kind and all and every specie of my stock except one mare hereafter mentioned with a full power of selling or otherwise using at her discretion any or every part of the said stock together with the three following negroes to wit, Lea, Tommy and Tom, which three last negroes I give and bequeath to my s^r Wife to her and her Heirs forever as a full exclusion from her right of dower as is also meant by the Estate mentioned above to Exclude her from her right of dower and only for her use so long as she remains my Widow.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James at the end of the period of the term to my wife that land and plantation lent to my s^r wife, Dick and Lill two negroes my young sonal mare and one Leather Bed and furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann, Phillis and Patt with their future increase and one Leather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah, great Phillis and moll with their future increase and one feather Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Phoebe, Judah and Dilsey with their future increase and one Leather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Lee the tract of Land he lives on containing by Estimation two

and Zilsey with their future increase and the same
Item I give and bequeath to my son Levi the tract of Land he lives on containing by Estimation two
Hundred and twelve Acres more or less one negroe man York with every part of my Estate which
he has now in his possession to him his heirs and assigns forever Item I give and bequeath to my
son William the tract of land he lives on which I purchased of James Hinton containing by Estimation
two hundred acres more or less with one negroe named Jack which he has in possession together
with all the rest of my Estate that he has now in his possession to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary bairness Elizabeth Cousins Lucy ^{Wilson} Spain and Rachel
all my Estate that they have in possession to be enjoyed by them as they now separately hold it
to them and their Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my two sons Levi and William

in addition to that which I have already given that a negroe man to be equally divided between them
to them and their heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Lucy Spain

and Rachel Wilson black Inn a negroe man in addition to that which I have already
given to be equally divided between them to them and their Heirs forever

Item my will and desire is that all my brog that may be upon hand at the time of my Death
be appoyed to the schooling of my wifes Children after her own and ^{her} childrens maintenance and that at
the period to which I have lent my wife a part of my land with other Property my further will
and desire is that that Estate so lent except the land be equally divided among my Children by my

son William the tract of land he lives on which I purchased of James Hinton containing by Estimation two hundred acres more or less with one negroe named Jack which he has in Possession together

with all the rest of my Estate that he has now in his Possession to him his heirs and assigns forever

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and desire is that that Estate so lent except the land be equally divided among my Children by my

said wife Ann Item and let it be well Remembered as a special part of this my will that

If at any time hereafter my wife should refuse to stans to this my last will that then in

that case it is my will and deliberate desire that all the Estate given to my several Children which I had by her be given to be equally divided between my Children which I had by my former wife all of which Estate if it should so unfortunately be divided I give to them & their heirs forever and if it should so happen that my wife should refuse to stand to this my will I do not mean in that case that the loan or gift to her should be confirmed and it is further my desire that my Estate should not be inventoried or appraised.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my son Law. Clark and my friend Abner Osborne Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
