

Thomas Moxley 1683 A.D.

In the name of God Amen, I John Moxley of Autauga County being sick and weak of body but
of sound and perfect sense and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following, witness my will and desire is that all my just
debts be first honestly paid by my Executors. Item I give and bequeath to my son Moxley
Elliott, four hundred and thirty acres of land lying and being in the County of Autauga
burg; also those Negroes named as follows, Miss Charles, James and Versaly, also forty
pounds Current Money which I lent him, the mentioned four hundred and thirty
acres of land which he has in possession I give to him and his heirs forever; with the above
mentioned Negroes, and their increase which he has in his possession I give to him and his
heirs forever, also the before mentioned forty pounds I give to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my five hereafter named grand children (sons and daughters
of my Daughter Betsy Moseley deceased) viz Susanna Moseley, Robert Moseley, Samuel Moseley
Edward Moseley, and William Moseley one negro woman named Lucy with her increase
to be equally divided between them when Susanna Moseley shall come to lawfull age to marry,

The before mentioned Negro woman Lucy was lent to my Daughter Betsy Moseley and is
now possession of the above named childrens Father Edward Moseley, which Negro woman and her
increase I give to the five above named children and their heirs forever to be divided
as above directed. Item I leave to my beloved wife Moxley Elliott the tract of Land with her
Plantation whereon I now live, with three Negroes that she shall bring brother to chose

I give to the five above named children and their heirs forever to be divided

as above directed. Item I leave to my beloved wife Hidelity Elliott the tract of land with the
plantation whereon I now live, with nine negroes that she shall thing proper to chose
out of my estate, also the sixth part of my stock of horses, cattle, sheep, & hogs with
a sixt^h of my household and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils and one
choice Bed and furniture with all my books. I leave to my Beloved wife Hidelity
all during her natural life or widowhood, and after her death or marriage, my well
and desire is that the nine negroes which she shall chose with their increase at the death
or marriage of my before mentioned, with the stock of horses, cattle, sheep, and hogs also
the sixt^h of my house hold and kitchen Furniture, and plantation utensils and the choice
bed and furniture also all my books, shall be equally divided between my three here-
after named children viz. William Elliott, Nancy Elliott and James Elliott, and if
either of them should die without heir or before they arrive to lawfull age the surviving
two shall have the whole and if two should die without heir or before they come to
lawfull age that the surviving one shall have the whole. Item I give and bequeath
to my son William Elliott the tract of land I purchased of Beasley containing two hundred
of forty acres lying and being in the County of Notoway on Nine mile Creek, with
five hundred acres of land being a part of that tract lying and being in the County
of Lancaster joining Brunswick, also one negro boy named Ben, the above mention-

Tracts of land with the before mentioned negro boy Ben I give to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Fancey Elliott one Negroe girl named Peg
with her increase, I give to my Daughter Fancey and her heirs forever. Item I give

and bequeath to my son James Elliott the Tract of land wheron I now live containing

Three hundred and Eighty five acres more or less after his mothers death from marriage

with three hundred acres of that land going & being in the County of Newbury before

mentioned to be taken from which and he thinks proper when he arrives to lawfull age,

with one negro boy named Joe & ~~the~~ son of ~~the~~ the above mentioned two tracts of land

with the before named negro boy I give to him and his heirs forever. Item My will

and desire is that all and every part of my estates, that is not yet devised and disposed

of shall be equally divided between my hereafter named children, viz: Master

Elliott, William Elliott, Fancey Elliott and James Elliott. and my Daughter Betsy Moseley's

five children viz, Luranna Moseley, Robert Moseley, Samuel Moseley, Edward Moseley

and William Moseley; that is that the five children shall divide between them equally

the part that would have been their brothers portion if she had been a liver. Further

my will and desire is that the portion which falls to my daughter Betsy Moseley's five

children shall remain in the hands of my executors until they come to lawfull age or

marry and that each have that portion as the come of age or marries. I constitute Ap-

point make and entain my loving wife Isabella Elliott Executrix and Henry T. Goff and

John Ross in Brunswick my whole and sole Executors to this my last will and

~~John Rogers in Brunswick my whole and sole Executors to this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly revoke all and every Will or Wills Testament or Testaments heretofore by me made and Legacy or legacies given in any otherwise than this. Reliegins and conforming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. Court held for Holloway County at the Courthouse, on Thursday the 2^d of June 1896.

This last will and Testament of John Elliott deceased was offered for proof by Henry Ferguson an executor herein named, and was proved by the oath of Asta Davis, John Vaughan, Alexander Bruce three of the witnesses thereto and is ordered to be recorded, whereupon the said Henry Ferguson and John Rogers the executors named in this will came into Court and refused to take upon themselves the burthen of the execution thereof, and on the motion of Martin Elliott a certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of Administration with this will annexed his having taken the oath of an Administrator and with John Rogers (3) Thomas J. Brooking, George Calamis and Uriah Lipscomb his securities entered into and acknowledged a Bond according to law
