Item I give my Daughter Elizabeth Dickerson Jennings Fifteen pounds and one
Feather Bed of the value of five pounds the Bed to be received when she comes of Age or Marrys

My desire is that all the Rest of my Children Receive twenty pounds when they comes of Age
or Marrys Mary Beasley Jennings Basha Cook Jennings Martha Clark Jennings

all the rest of my Estate Real and Personal for the Supporting and Scolling of my younger
