I have given unto my beloved wife the plantation I land whereon I now live also I have given unto my said wife one negro man named Jerry with half of my house hold & kitchen furniture also one horse named Edith also four cows & calves also all my stock of sheep during her life. Item I give and bequeath unto my sons William Womack & Bird Womack my tract of land lying in Prince Edward County to be equally divided to them and their heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Waddle one cow and calf, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Womack and Eliza Womack my tract of land in Lunenburg County to be Equally divided to them and their heirs, also my tract of land whereon I now live after the death of my wife, to them and their heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Womack one negro man named Abraham to him and his heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my son Bird Womack one negro man named Jay to him and his heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Edith Womack one negro woman namedaddy to her and her heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Willy Womack one negro boy named Randolp to her and her heirs - Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza Womack one negro boy named Abram to her and her heirs, Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza Womack thirty pounds Cash, Item I give and bequeath unto my son Bird Womack thirty pounds Cash, Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Edith Womack my white footed Jim brack kolt, Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Willy Womack my other Jim brack kolt, Item my will and Desire is all the rest of my Estate after my just debts is paid to be Equally Divided amongst my five Children, William Womack Bird Womack Edith Womack Mary Womack and Rebecca Womack.

This last will and testament of Josiah Wornack deceased was offered for proof by William Wornack one of the executors therein named and was proved by the oaths of Griffin Lamborn and John Hamer two of the witnesses thereto and is ordered to be recorded, whereupon Elizabeth Wornack widow of the said Josiah Wornack deceased, came into Court and declared that she would not take or accept the provision made for her by this will or any part thereof, I pronounced all benefit which she might claim by the said will, and on the motion of the said executor a certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of this will, he having taken the oath of an executor & with Josiah Thompson and Freeman Jordan his securities entered into and acknowledged abroad according to law
