following to wit I Give unto my loving wife Nanny Bevil during her
life or widowhood all my estate both real and personal and at her death
or intermarriage it is my Will and desire that my lands be equally divided
between my three sons I said Bevil: William Bevil and Joseph Bevil
and to them and their heirs forever - Item it is my Will and desire that all my
Just debts be paid out of my personal estate with the crop that may be on hand
at the time of my death - Item it is my Will and desire at the death of my
wife Nanny Bevil that the whole of my personal estates be equally divided
between my eleven following children to wit Mary Hood, I said Bevil, M. Bevil
Nancy Hood, Patsy Bevil, Mattie Bevil, Rachel Bevil, Joseph Bevil Jr
Jenny Bevil, Elizabeth Bevil, Shirley Bevil all of which I give to them and
their heirs ~~forever~~ or legal representatives forever - And lastly I do
hereby constitute and appoint my two sons I said Bevil & M. Bevil and
Carront with executors to this my last Will and Testament revoking all
former Wills by me made - In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto
affixed my hand and seal this 28th day of September 1867
