

182) In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Grammer of the parish & County of Katooway, being sick, but of perfect intellectual faculty do make this my last Will & Testament, in manner & form following that is to say
Imprimis I lend to my beloved wife Rachel Grammer, during her natural life or Widowhood, & no longer one hundred acres of Land of the tract whereon I now live, & two negroes (viz) Bond & Aggy one feather bed & furniture, two work horses, a Black and a Bay, six head of Cattle & ten head of hogs.

Item I give to my son William Grammer one hundred acres of Land whereon he now lives which I purchased of Powell & Jackson & one negro Boy named Bob to him & his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Joseph Grammer eighty acres of Land (be the same more or less) which I purchased of Thomas Jackson, and one negro girl named Biddy and her increase, to him & his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Burwell Temple Grammer my Manor Plantation (at my wife's death or marriage) and one negro girl named Put, with her increase, to him & his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Nancy Draper one negro girl named Mary, with her increase, to her & her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Molly Grammer one negro girl named Tab, with her increase, to her & her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Sally Grammer one negro Boy named Jeff to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Betsey Grammer one negro girl named Lucy with her increase to her & her Heirs forever.

I Will that the two negroes & their increase (which I have lent my wife) at her death) shall be sold and the money arising to be equally divided, between my Seven Children (viz) William Grammer, Joseph Grammer, Burwell T. Grammer, Nancy Draper, Molly Grammer & Betsey Grammer ^{Sally Grammer}

Further more with desire that all my Estate, which I have not already divided shall be sold, and my son Burwell Grammer shall be entitled to the sum of seven hundred & thirty pounds & ten shillings & six pence

Grammer shall be entitled to the sum of seventy pounds & then have an equal share among his other
Brothers & Sisters above named.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friends Henry Cousins, John Smith & William Moore
Executors of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all other & former Wills, by me heretofore made.

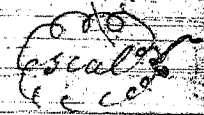

and the motion of the said Executors a certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat of the said Will
tho having taken the oath of Executors and with John. for Thos. Cannon & Co. their securities
entered into a recognizance to law
