

In the name of God amen I, Sarah Thomas of Nottoway County, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. Giving my soul into the hands of my creator hoping for the remissions of my sins; and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors, as for my earthly goods and chattels, I give & devise to my son Spencer Thomas to him and his heirs for ever. Viz my part of the land, negroes and stock of every kind, and every other thing not already given by me. Except my dwelling house, that I give & devise to my two daughters, namely Petty Thomas & Polley Thomas to be possessed by them freely & unmolested by the rest of my Children, if either of my said daughters should marry or die it is my desire for the other sister to enjoy the said house as her lawful property and after her death or marriage to return again to my son Spencer Thomas to him and his heirs for ever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty seventh day of October 1795
