 think proper I then I give unto my daughter Rebecca Jones a chest
 of drawers a square table and a dressing table to her and her heirs
 forever I leave unto my said daughter one negro boy named Black one to
 be disposed of at her death amongst her children as she may think
 proper I then It is my will and desire that my daughter Margaret
 B. Jones may have the use and benefit of one negro girl Lucy
 during her life and at her death to be disposed of amongst her
 children as she thinks proper I then It is my will and desire that my
 Executors pay unto each of my daughters one hundred pounds
 out of the moneys Bonds and accounts due me and the balance of

said money I give unto my son Peter B. Jones to him and his heirs
forever Lastly I do hereby appoint Peter B. Jones my son and John
Stuart exors. This my last will and testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first
day of February in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand eight
hundred and four
