Item I give unto my son Daniel Hudson one horse colt one sow and pigs also one bee hive. Item I give unto my son Benj. Hudson one young horse by name of Lightfoot Bridle and Saddle one Cart and two Oxen one saw and pigs one Bed Bedstead of furniture one whip saw, one large Pot and Hooks, one middle size pot and Hooks, one small dutch Oven, one small pair tongs and Shovel, one pair wedges, one frow, one Broad Ax, one Claw knife, one foot adze, one Bee hive one black walnut chest, one small Trunk, two chairs, two augers & three chisels & Coopers Tools &c. Item I give unto my daughter Mary Hudson one negro man Tom, one Bed. Bedstead of furniture one more named flower with her increase. Bridle and Saddle, two large steers, one sow and pigs, two sheep, two chairs, two flat Irons, one large Kettle, one large Dutch Oven and Hooks, one middle size pot one small Pot and Hooks, one pair Stillbacks, one pair large tongs and Shovel, one Grid Iron, one coffee mill, one coffee pot, one looking Glass, one large black walnut chest. one small Trunk, one wheelbarrow. The balance of my pewter to be equally divided between my son Benjamin and my daughter Mary Hudson also one Box of Seven pounds four shillings to be laid in different kinds of furniture for the said last mention children. And my desire is for every thing that will be left me after the above mentioned what balance shall remain if any be all and every thing sold and the money arising

one small Pot and Hooks, one pair Stillions, one pair large tongs and shovel, one glass, one
milk, one coffee pot, one looking glass, one large black walnut chest, one small trunk, one wheel
barrow. The balance of my pewter to be equally divided between my son Benjamin and my daughter Mary
Hudson also one Box of seven pounds four shillings to be laid in different kinds of furniture for the said
last mention children. And my desire is for every thing that will be left me after the above mentioned
legacies be made up, what balance shall remain if any be all and every thing sold and the money arising
from the same be equally divided between my five children. And lastly I do appoint George Snellings &
Rebecca Snellings my executors of this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made
