furniture one chest also all my wearing clothes so Dispose
as he shall think proper likewise all my out standing debts
of every kind and species what ever with every other of my
Estate to him and his heirs forever last of all I do nominate
constitute and appoint Henry Hooper and William More
my sole & sole Executors to this my last will and Testament
Resolving all other my Wishes which I have hereunto set
my hand & affix my seal this thirteenth day of July one
