Tobacco now on hand and the residue of my said crops together with
all my stock of cattle, sheep, and hogs my feather bed & furniture
and all the rest of my household and kitchen furniture (not
already disposed of) and plantation utensils of every description
I give and bequeath to my son William Blaroy & to his heirs for
ever. Thus I give and bequeath unto my particular friends
Martha Mills wife of Edmund Mills all my Trunks of every
description and lastly I constitute and appoint my son William
Blaroy sole executor of this my last Will and Testament, revok-
ing and annulling all former Wills by me made. In witness
