and all & every property that may hereafter fall to me from the death
of any persons whatsoever real or personal which said sums of money
all other property I give to her and her heirs forever

I do appoint my friend John Geach my lawful Executor I do hereby
make void and annul all wills and conveyances heretofore
given under my hand and seal this fourteenth day of December
One thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty nine
