for all men once to do & make this my last will and Testament in the following manner
and form Ver. Imprimis My will is that all my just debts be honestly paid

Item as I have already provided for my seven Eldest Children as they married off to such
Richard Robertson, Elizabeth Lowkes, Sarah Spain, James Robertson, Mary May Parker, Robert
Robertson and Martha Walton my desire is that they should have no more of my Estate

Item I give and bequeath to my son Caswell Robertson 100⁰⁰ and 1⁰⁰ Negro out of my
Estate or fifty Pounds Cash in-lieu of the Negro to be at the option of my Executors to be
delivered him next December twelve months to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Robertson one hundred acres of land in New
man named Storling to be delivered him next December twelve months one Leather Bed &
furniture 2 Cows and Calves 2 Sows and Pigs to be delivered him next fall all of which

I give to him and to his heirs forever Item I lend to my beloved wife Anne Robertson
during her widow hood my dwelling house and plantation wherein I now live also garden,
Sue, Lucy, and debts for her support and the support of my four youngest children, Nathaniel

J. Robertson, Peter Robertson, Christopher Robertson and Nancy Robertson also my Stock of all

kinds, household and kitchen furniture and plantation themselves I lend to my wife in the before

mentioned way. Item my will and desire is that my four Negroes Lucy and her three

children Fanny, Cloe, and Phillis and their increase to be equally divided among my four youngest
children, Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher and Nancy as they come of age or marry

to them and their heirs forever. Item I will that at the separation of my wife's widowhood

that the Negroes which I lend her and Stock &c be applyed to the discharge of my Debts if any

and the remainder to be equally divided among my six youngest children (to wit) Paschal,

William, Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher, and Nancy Robertsons

Item my desire is that the land wherein I now live after my wife ceases to be a widow be

Equally divided among my four youngest children Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher,
and Nancy, Robertsons, at they come of age or marry.

Item I will that nothing herein contained be misconstrued for want of form or form in
law and also nominate constitute and appoint my son William Robertson Executor to

this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
