

In the name of God Amen the 10th day of January 1795 I Nathaniel Robertson of Ketterway being sick and weak but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do hereby make this my last will and Testament in the following manner and form Viz. Imprimis My will is that all my Just debts be honestly paid.

Item as I have already provided for my seven Eldest Children as they married off to wit Richard Robertson, Elizabeth Towlkes, Sarah Spain, James Robertson, Mary May Porter, Robert Robertson and Martha Walton my desire is that they should have no more of my Estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Pascale Robertson 1 Feather Bed and 1 Negroe out of my Estate or fifty pounds Cash in lieu of the Negroe to be at the option of my Executors to be delivered him next December twelve months, to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Robertson, one hundred acres of land 1 Negroe man named Sterling to be delivered him next December twelve months, one Feather Bed & furniture 2 Cows and Calves 2 sows and Pigs to be delivered him next fall all of which

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I give to him and to his heirs forever. Item I lend to my beloved wife Anne Robertson during her widowhood my dwelling house and plantation whereon I now live also Lydia, Sue, Lucy, and Scott for her support and the support of my four youngest children, Nathaniel I. Robertson, Peter Robertson, Christopher Robertson and Nancy Robertson also my stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils I lend to my wife in the before

mentioned way. Item my will and desire is that my four negroes Lucy and her three children, Fanny, Cloe, and Phillis and their increase to be equally divided among my four youngest children, Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher and Nancy as they come of age or marry to them and their heirs forever. Item I will that at the expiration of my wifes widowhood

that the negroes which I lend her and stock to be applyed to the discharge of my Debts if any and the remainder to be equally divided among my six youngest children (to wit) Paschall, William, Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher, and Nancy Robertsons

Item my desire is that the land whereon I now live after my wife ceases to be a widow be Equally divided among my four youngest children. Nathaniel Thompson, Peter, Christopher, and Nancy Robertsons, as they come of age or marry.

Item I will that nothing herein contained be misconstrued for want of form or form in Law and also nominate constitute and appoint my son William Robertson Executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year first above written
