heirs forever. Item I further give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Ann Dunnevant four negroes vizt. Dick, Ned, Jincy & Elsey
them and their increase together with all the rest of my
Estate both real and personal to her and her heirs forever.
Lastly I do nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Ann
Dunnevant and Samuel Dunnevant Executors and Executors
to this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day
of July and in the year of our Lord 1801.
