being of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain <sup>to be</sup> ~~this~~ <sup>my</sup> last will  
and Testament in manner and form following First my will and desire is  
that all my just Ditts be paid from the crops that shall be made this Year  
On my Plantation and if they should not prove Sufficient for that purpose  
~~the residue~~ to be paid from the sale of my Carpenters Tools one feather  
bed and furniture one bay Mare called Lister and my bay Horse and such as may  
be due me then I Give unto my beloved Wife Rebecca Huggins during her natural  
life the third of land I now live on purchased of John Worsham and containing  
by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less also one Negro man  
named Jack and the use of the Orchard on the Place called Pontons which I  
purchased of Peter Pontons also the rails on the land I purchased of William  
Worsham to be applied for the purpose of repairing her fences only I also  
give unto my said Wife and her heirs forever one third part of my household  
and kitchen furniture and one third part of the residue of my stock

On the estate of Carter Higgins an Executor named in this Will  
not he having taken the Oath of an Executor I wish to be settled  
myself as executor to the  
State of Massachusetts D.C.P.

of all kind consisting of Horses Cows and hogs and one third of my  
plantation interests I have given unto Maryann Ince my wife  
life provided she does not marry and if she does marry only during  
her Single State One tract of land containing by estimation one  
hundred acres be the same more or less which land I purchased  
of Peter Jones (now) dead but with the express restriction of cutting  
any wood or timber on the said land except for the purpose of  
repairing <sup>the</sup> fences on the same and for fire wood also land unto the  
said Maryann Ince the Rents which inclose a piece on the tract  
of land I purchased of Peter Hinton separate from the inclosure  
near a Pontons House for the purpose of repairing the fences on the land  
but to her and to be applied to no other purpose I have given unto my  
brother Carter Higgins and his heirs forever one York of young Steers  
I have given unto my brother Thomas Higgins and his heirs  
forever fifteen pounds to be paid to him next fall I have
