^{the owner of} ~~of nothing~~ being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make, ordain
and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form
following to wit: I give devise and bequeath to my son Peter
Randolph Bland the land and Plantation whereon I live called, Wyfield
and one negroe boy called Hobb, to him and his heirs forever I then give
devise and bequeath to my daughter Ann Bland, one negroe girl named
Sally to her and her heirs forever — I then give ^{devise} ~~bequeath~~ and bequeath
to my daughter Elizabeth Ridley Bland one negroe girl named Betty to her
and her heirs forever — I then give devise and bequeath to my daughter Sally
Dickins Bland one negroe girl named Potts to her and her heirs forever —
I then give devise and bequeath to my daughters Ann Bland, Elizabeth
Ridley Bland, and Sally Dickins Bland my land and plantations, lying
on the Herriman Creek, to be equally divided, between them according to quan-
tity and quality, to them and their heirs forever — I then all the rest of residue
of my estate, together with what has been devised to me by the last Will and
testament of my late sister Ann Bland, I give devise and bequeath to my
son Peter R Bland, and my daughters, Ann Bland, Elizabeth Ridley Bland
and Sally Dickins Bland to be equally divided between them, to them and
their heirs forever — I then I give devise and bequeath that my brother
Peter Bland & Edmund Bland should divide my estate according to the clauses

Widley Island; and Salley, Mennas Island and plantations; lying
on the Herrican Creek, to be equally divided, between them according to quan-
tity and quality, to them and their heirs forever — I Item all the rest of
my estate, together with what has been devised to me, by the last Will and
testament of my late sister Ann Bland, I give devise and bequeath to my
son Peter R Bland, and my daughters, Ann Bland, Charlotte Buckley Bland
and Sally Dickins Bland to be equally divided between them, to them and
their heirs forever — I Item I desire and request that my brother
Peter Bland & Edward Bland should divide my estate according to the clauses
of this my Will between my son and daughters — Lastly I constitute and app-
oint my brother Edward Bland guardian to my son and daughters; and do
recite to this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the fourth day of April in the
Year of our Lord ^{Christ} One thousand eight hundred & seven —

And on the motion of Edw^d Blane an executor therein named, a certificate was granted him for obtaining a fidate of the said Will in due form he having now taken the oath with security entered into and acknowledged a bond for that purpose according to law — Teste

In the name of God Amen; I Ann Blane of the County of Notaway: being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my Last Will and testament: to wit I give devise and bequeath to my mother all my estate, both real and personal, during her life, and after her death, I give to my brother Edward my plantation and the ^{following} negroes to wit: Charles, George, Carlos Patrum and Pelley, and to my Brothers Richard and Peter Blane the following negroes to wit: Husb, little David, Tom and Giles: I
