and weak but of sound mind and memory thanks be to god for the same I do hereby make my last
Will and Testament revoking all other wills or wills by me before made first I give my soul to god
that gave it, in hopes at the general reurrection, to receive it again with joy, and for my worldly
Estate I dispose of in manner and form following viz. I in promise do bind unto my wife Mildred
Burks as much of the Income of my old Stone place as shall be thought sufficient for her support
for and during term of her natural life or widowhood I also bind unto my said wife all my house
hold furniture also all my stock of all kinds also all kinds of working Tools, for and during
her life and widowhood Item I give and bequeath the old Stone place together with One hundred
and Sixty eight and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres of land adjoining therunto lying in Prince Edward and Notaway

Gives my son Richard Lloyd Banks, and to his heirs forever also, after his mother deceased I give
unto my son Richard Lloyd Banks all my household furniture and my stock of all kinds, whatsoever and
all my working tools—now and with standing they above things and to my said wife if my said son
Richard Lloyd Banks shall support his mother with such things as shall be thought sufficient for
her support and finding her a Horse and saddle to ride when she wants my desire is that my said
son upon his satisfying his mother, that he is to have the whole in his possession and to do what he thinks
proper with it as his own, I also give and bequeath unto my said son Richard Lloyd Banks Two hundred
acres of Land and Plantation which I give Christopher Dugornett and Joyce Owen a Due for to indemnify
them as securitys for me in a suit Hatcher & Banks now if my said son shall pay the said judgment
I give him the said land to him and his heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that after my sons
receiving the before mentioned land and premises that he pay to my two daughters, minded Anna
and Elizabeth Banks Fifty pounds each or give them a Negroe Girl, a pease to their liking instead of
the money. Item my will and desire is that a negroe Girl that I some years agoe delivered to my
daughter Edith Langdon may continue to her and her heirs forever, also all the said Girls by the names
of Name increase to her and to her heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that my daughter

of mine increase to her and to ~~it~~ her heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that my daughter
Elizabeth Burks is to continue with her mother in the same rooms as long as she lives single and
chooses so to do and that she may have a place for her horse; and her bedding if she chooses to keep them.
Item my will and desire is that they negroes that I give and deliver to my sons Charles, John and
Burke's Thompson that they may continue to them and their heirs forever except one that I lent to my son
Charles Burks, when he went to Kentucky by the name of Peter - my will and desire is that has the
said negro Peter may be sold for the best price that can be got for him and the sum of money that
Benjamin Rice paid to Johnston Executors for a negro woman I gave to my daughter Mary Rice wife to
the said Benjamin Rice by the name of Fannie and recovered of Rice by the executors that out of the
money arising from the sale of the said negro Peter, that said Rice is to receive the sum he paid
to the said executors of Peter Johnston for the negro I am that they recovered of him. Item the balance
of the money arising from the said negro Peter I desire may be laid out in buying a negro to wait
on my wife so long as she shall live a widow and after her decease to be divided to my sons
Richard Lloyd Burks and my daughter Elizabeth Burks, provided they are to take care of their mother.

Item the Judgment £300⁰⁰ is to be discharge by my husband after mentioned executors by selling land or
other ways as my will and desire is that my secretary is not to suffer on that account. Item my will
and desire is that all damages that can or is required by means of the like treatment & service

from Johnston Executors and other just recovery that can be got may be equally divided between

all my liberators after my executor deducting all his expences and costs that he should be at
not remunerated Item my will and desire is that so soon as my Executor can get the business
settled that he buys a negro Girl and give it to Martha Banks daughter of my son Philemon
Banks provided also if necessary made sufficient my will and desire is that my Executor buy
a Horse, and saddle at the Price of Fifteen or twenty pounds when the said Martha or Patsey
Banks daughter of Philemon Banks comes to the age of twelve Years to give her the said Horse and saddle
Item the negroe I mentioned to be given to my Granddaughter Patsey or Martha is to be between Fifteen
and Twenty years old and likely Item my will and desire is that if the negroe fit for which there is
a suit depending in Prince Edward Court against George Banks Junr is recovered that my Executor
may sell him for the best price that can be got for him if he should think fit to sell him
and at my wife decease the money arising from the sale of the said negroe is to be equally
divided as before among all my children but that my executor is and may lay out the said
money as he shall think fit till my wife decease and only be liable for the Principle sum at
the division as the other will be for the support of my wife for her life Item my will and desire
is that all just debts that can be made appear against me to be paid let them be long or

short standing and all that appears for me to be paid is the same manner too. Lastly I do
constitute and appoint my beloved wife and my son Richard Lloyd Burks executors of this my
last will and Testament; and that my executrix and my executors is not to give or be held
to Secrecy for the performance of this will signed with my own hand and sealed with my seal

and dated this third day of June one thousand seven hundred and ninety three
