In the name of God Amen, I Richard Loring
of the County of Marlborough being weak in body but
sound in mind and memory do make this my last will
and testament revoking all former Wills by me
for me made In manner and form following Viz
I give and bequeath to my son Lissie
Lissie all the east part of my Land that lies on
the south side of my Spring Branch wherever the
new line to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Josiah
Josiah and my daughter Jean Lissie equally all
the residue of my Land lying on the north side
of the aforesaid Spring Branch and all the appur-
tenances thereof to them and their heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Josiah Lissie
and my daughter Jean Lissie and my grand son
Charles Lissie all the rest of my Estate that is

and my daughter Jane Lissie and my grand son
Blair Lissie Lissie all the rest of my Estate that is
not named in this will to be equally divided among
them. And there their forever.
I will and desire it that this be the more ap-
-provement of my Estate. And Lastly, I do appoint
my son Charles Lissie and Laurence Crumshaw the sole
Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal
this twenty eighth day of July eighteen hundred and
four. Signed sealed and acknowledged to be the

1st I will that all my Estate be sold together as my
Lands under the authority of my Executor & after
received from the sale the proceeds of the same
