

I Robert Wingham Sen^r of the County of Wotton do
hereby make my last will and testament in manner
following My I leave to my beloved wife during
her natural life that part of my lands lying and being
in the flock of the West Lincoln. Hanc. Home. Church in
this County whereon stand the dwelling houses in
which I now live also the following negroes viz. Phill.
Lew. Ben. Barnett. I leave by deed giving her (viz)
Lynette with fourteen head of cattle such as she may
choose from my stock and four horses of her choice
together with all my household and kitchen furniture
of plantation utensils of every sort and kind her name
to be in lieu of her dower,
I give to my son John the tract of land where he
now lives in the County of Charlotte containing by estimation
100 acres &c the same more or less together with

two magazines called Arthur's Quarterly where he has
ready received with all these increase from before &
hereafter - I also such articles of stock and furniture
as she has now in possession to have and to her heirs
and assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Rindley two negro
called Daniel & Phillis whom she has already received
with all these increase from before and hereafter
together with such articles of furniture and stock
as she has now in possession to have and to her
heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Martha with her negro called
Fanny whom she has already received with
all these increase from before and hereafter together
with such articles of furniture and stock as she has
now in possession to have and to her heirs and assigns

more no profession to her and to her heirs and assigns
forever

I give to my daughter Ann Wright two negroes
John's son & Anney whom she has already
received with all their increase hereafter and
hereafter together with such articles of furniture
and stock as she has now in possession to her
and to her heirs and assigns forever

I give to my son Robert my tract of Land
lying in the County of Henrico situated at L & L
where he the same now or he together with the
two following negroes viz Pompey & Charles
whom he has already received with all their increase
hereafter and hereafter I also such articles of
furniture and stock as he now has in possession
to him and to his heirs and assigns forever

December 6th 1805

I give to my son Joseph the proceeds of my
Kentucky Lands sold lately to Richard I.
Munford for the sum of one thousand pounds
Current money one hundred pounds of which is
already received by me and the remaining
nine hundred pounds still are by the said
Munford as per his several bills payable at
different dates hereafter together with a horse
saddle and bridle which he has already given
to him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my son James two negroes called Edick
& John with their increase living and after the
date of this my will together with a saddle horse
saddle and bridle now in his possession also two
Cows and a pig and one bed and furniture to
him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my son also two negroes viz. Dick & Saml
with their increase living and after the date of

with three increase of one and after the date of
this my will together with a black horse saddle
and saddle now in his possession also two Cow Slaves
one bed and furniture to him and to his heirs and
assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Elizabeth the lot of six
acres viz. Paul, Nancy, Charlotte, Anderson, Martin
and Oliver with three increase of one and after the
date of this my will together with two Cows and calves
and one bed and furniture and also one calf
mare called Eclipse with a saddle and bridle to her
and to her heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my son John Felt the tract of land
whereon I now live containing by estimation 110 1/2 acres
(part of which is lent to my wife during her life
as is herein before expressed) to be divided between them

by a new line already charted beginning at the mouth
of the long branch and running from thence across
Causey meandering to the old Courthouse road (and
thence along the said old road to a corner white
Oak in Portland towards the lower part lying
on the East side of the said line I give and bequeath
to my son James to him and his heirs and assigns forever
and the upper part thereof lying on the west side
of the said line I give and bequeath to my son
Cass to him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

It is my will and desire that the Household and
Kitchen Furniture and plantation utensils now to my
wife during her life shall be at her death equally
divided between my two sons James Cass to them and
to their heirs respectively forever.

It is also my further will and desire that the

It is also my further will and desire that the
measures and stock of every kind I possess before lent
to my wife during her life shall be at her death
equally divided between my three sons Robert James
and John and David and give the same according
to them my said three sons and to their heirs
and assigns respectively forever

All the rest of my Estate both real and personal
of what nature or kind soever it may be not
before mentioned or particularly disposed of, I desire may be equally
divided among my three sons Robert James John
which I give to them and their heirs and assigns
forever

I desire that no appraisement of my Estate shall
take place or be made

and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
my three sons Robert James and John Executors

of this my last will (and Testament). hereby
revoking all other or former wills or Testaments
by me heretofore made, In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th
day of March 1805
