I give it to their children and to their heirs forever.
But should any of them die without lawful issue its
my will that their parts be equally divided amongst my
children that are then alive.

Lastly I do recommend and appoint my loving wife Susanna
Wood to be the guardian of the said children and to have full power

I do nominate and appoint my loving wife Susanna
Wood Richards (her) and Charles Wood my whole and
exclusive to this my last will and testament thereby revoking
and making all others wills made by me void
