I William Craddock of Attorney County being of a perfect mind & memory through divine mercy, but calling unto mind the mortality of my Body, not knowing when it may please God to call me hence, I desire that my worldly Estate where with it hath been the good pleasure of the Lord to bestow upon me in this life may be disposed of in the following manner Viz.

Item, I give & bequeath to my Sons John Craddock, William Croft Craddock, Moses Craddock, Charles Craddock, David Craddock & Robert Craddock and my Daughters Mary Jeter & Judith Smith Five Shillings each, to them & their heirs for ever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my Son Edward Craddock the Tract of Land whereon I now live lying on the North side of my Spring Branch, adjoining Woods & Royals Lands containing Forty Acres be the same more or less, one Bed & furniture, which I give to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my Son Archer Craddock the Tract of Land whereon he now lives adjoining Royals Lands & on the South x x x side of my said Spring Branch containing Forty Acres be the same more or less one Bed & furniture, which I give to him & his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my said two Sons Edward Craddock & Archer Craddock, one negroe woman named Delce with her full increase, one negroe Boy named Proctor & one negroe Child named James to be equally divided between them which I give to them and their heirs for ever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sally Craddock one negroe Girl named Lick & her increase one Bed & furniture, three head of Cattle & one large Trunk which I give to her and her heirs forever.

Item, My will and desire is that after my just debts are paid, that the remainder of my Estate be it in what kind or quality it may, should be equally divided between my Daughters Edith

Item, My will and desire is that after my just debts are paid, that the remainder of my Estate be it in what kind or quality it may, should be equally divided between my Daughters Edith Craddock & Hannah Craddock, which I give to them and their heirs for ever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughters Edith Craddock & Hannah Craddock and my Sons Edward Craddock & Archer Craddock the Legacy that may hereafter fall to me ^{or} ~~out~~ of ^{Edward} Edmund Harper's Estate, to be equally divided between them, which I give to them and their heirs for ever.

My desire is, that there should be no appraisement of my Estate.

I do hereby conclude & appoint my friends James Dupuy Junr & my Sons Edward Craddock & Archer Craddock executors of this my last Will & Testament.

My will is, that nothing hereon contained be misg construed for want of ~~them~~ ^{form} or form in Law.
