I, William Davis of Nottoway County do constitute this my last will & testament in manner and form (Wiz) I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary three negroes named as follows George Peggy and Emanuel, with one yoke of steers and Cart, two hams of her choice with all my stock of hogs & one horse and saddle which she may choose one trunk, one brand with her choice of cards and wheel her choice of Feather beds with one ~~stead~~ ^{bed} and mat two sheets counterpane two blankets one bed quilt & pillow all of her choice one table six chairs one cobbed all of her choice with what glass ware and ~~the~~ ^{the} Earthen and tin ware I have my chest and looking glass hand Irons shovel and poking Iron one box Iron & heaters candle stick six table spoons & six tea spoons one case of knives and forks one trivet one middle size pot & hooks one small Dutch Oven tea kettle frying pan one loom with the staves and the hanks with one choice pail with all the meat and grain in the house and all the ^{crop of - now} grain in the field and the cotton in the house and patch with all the plantation tools of every kind with one small chest & one washing tub and my desire is that all the negroes stay on the plantation to finish the 2^d crop

And further my will and desire is that the balance of my Estate not herein mentioned of every kind be Equally divided betwixt my Children each one to have an Equal share that is after my just debts are paid. And further I do hereby appoint Nathaniel Lee and my son Asa Davis my Executors to have this my last will Executed according to the tenor hereof.
