I do give and commend my soul into the hands of god my creator, hoping and as-
suredly believing through the only merits of Jesus Christ my saviour to be re-
partaker of life everlasting and my body to the earth wheresoever that is maner
and as to such worldly goods and chattels as it has pleased god to bless me with,
I dispose of them in the following manner Vizt I will give and bequeath
to my daughter Mary Muddavants Thomas and her heirs forever, whenem she mar-
ries or comes of age two negroes Vizt Old Bob and Patty with all her future
increase, likewise, a best saddle and bridle to be worth Twenty five pounds, a
Chest of Drawers, and one sixth part of all my household furniture, stock of
cattle, sheep and hogs I will give and bequeath to my daughter Francis
Williams Thomas and her heirs forever, when ever she marries or comes of age
she receives Vizt Mary and Lydia with all their future increase, likewise
a best saddle and bridle to be worth Twenty five pounds, a Chest of drawers, and
one fifth part of the household furniture, stock of Cattle, sheep and hogs that
may be remaining after my daughter Marys one sixth part is taken out
I will give to my son Robert Madley Thomas and his heirs forever whenem he

I give to my son Robert Woodley Thomas and his heirs forever, whenever he comes of age, all that Tract of Land, which I purchased of Malins Croft, commonly called maymards tract, likewise two negroes Edmund & Jerry a best saddle & a bridle to be worth Twenty five pounds, a Malin's best, and one fourth part of the household Furniture. Stocks of Cattle, Sheep and Hogs that may be remaining after my daughters Mary & Frances parts are taken out, likewise the sum of Twenty five pounds for the purpose of educating them, also the sum of fifty pounds to put him in building. I give and bequeath unto my daughter when she comes of age, her heirs forever, whenever she marries or comes of age, two negroes, best and bridle with all their furniture, likewise a best saddle and bridle to be worth Twenty five pounds, a chest of Drawers, and one third part of the household Furniture, stock of Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, that may be remaining after my daughters and son Robert's parts are taken out. I give and bequeath to my son Saml^r Thomas and his heirs forever, the tract of Land whereon I reside, being the same which my son Robert Woodley left to me, likewise two negroes (Jill & Dick) and Rob, a best saddle and bridle to be worth Twenty five pounds, a Malin's best, and one half of the household Furniture, Stocks of Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, that may be remaining after the above mentioned Children's parts are taken out, I give to him after he comes of age, likewise the sum of Twenty five pounds for the purpose of educating him.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Williams, then my own
 wife Putney and Henry, both, under and under, to be with Hardy
 her friends a lot of money and the remainder of the household furniture
 and cattle, ^{that} which I give to her and her heirs forever when she
 marries or comes of age. I also give and bequeath to my dear and loving
 wife during her life and ~~and~~ ^{then} ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~children~~ ^{children} William, John, Daniel
 and Rebecca, ~~the use of~~ the mansion house and plantation, she
 is likewise to have the use of all the property ~~until~~ ^{until} the children comes of
 age or marries, at the death of my wife it is my will and desire that the
 three negro fellows, Tom, Daniel & Rebecca be equally divided among
 my ~~children~~ ^{children}. I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends
 Messrs. Newson, Pierce, John Jackson and Spencer Thomas executors of
 this my last Will and Testament, not doubting but that they will see justice
 done to my wife and children. And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke
 and annul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests
 and executors, by me in any wise before made, Made and bequeathed, ratifying
 and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
