In the name of God amen. I James Madison of the County of Orange being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: Principally I most humbly implore the mercy of Almighty God, through the merits of Jesus Christ, to inherit eternal life; my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named; and as to my temporal estate, I give and dispose thereof as follows.

Item. I give and devise unto my son James the tract of Land wherein I now live, which was given and bequeathed to me by my late Father by his last Will and Testament bearing date the 31st day of July 1732, containing about one thousand eight hundred acres, be the same more or less, to him and his for ever subject over the less to my desire and direction herein after.

mentioned. I also give and devise unto my said son James the land I bought
of the late Revd John Dixon lying on the Rappidan River in Culpeper County
and containing four hundred and twenty five Acres, be the same more or less,
to him and his heirs forever; provided he makes no charge or claim
against me hereafter for the use or profits I received or had of his Negroes
whilst I had them in possession; for which I have already made him
ample amends in money and lands heretofore given.

Item I give and devise unto my son Ambrose, the lands I bought of the
late George Brook Gent. containing five hundred and fifty five Acres
be the same more or less: also the lands I bought of the late Thomas Chew
Gent. containing two hundred acres and conveyed to me by two Deeds from
the said Thomas Chew and Martha his wife one bearing date the 25th of
April 1752 for 100 acres, and the other the 2^d day of February 1753 for
100 acres both of which being recorded in the County Court of Orange;
also the lands I bought of the late Samuel and James Chew which
were given to them by Thomas Chew their Father and conveyed to
them by two Deeds of Indentures, one bearing date the 3^d day of May
1751, and the other the 23^d day of November 1752, and are recorded in
the County Court of Orange; all which lands I devise to my said Ambrose
and to his heirs forever; subject nevertheless to my will and directions herein
after mentioned.

Item I give and devise unto my son Francis, the thousand acres of land
whereon he now lives, and which I conveyed to him by a Deed bearing date
the fourteenth day of August 1784 and which is recorded in the County
Court of Culpeper; the title and boundaries of the said land I do hereby
confirm and establish to him his heirs forever; the boundaries in the
said mentioned to run a southwesterly course from four bushes corner to
Robert Alcock by the road side, being since laid off are as followeth—
to wit. Beginning at the said four bushes and running thence along the road
south eleven degrees west fifty six poles, thence south fifty nine poles
thence south six degrees West forty eight poles, thence south forty two
degrees East, two hundred and seventy nine poles to a white Hickory & two
small gums on the river bank at the mouth of a small branch and
at the upper end of Mauldin's bent, thence up the river to the beginning
it being part of the land I purchased of Benjamin Grogan, Gentleman.
Item I give and devise unto my son William the remainder of the said
land that I purchased of the said Benjamin Grogan and to his heirs
forever, subject nevertheless to my will and directions herein after mentioned.

Item I give and devise unto my sons James and Ambrose as Tenants in common
My mill with Ten acres of land adjoining to it, and to their heirs for ever, notwithstanding the above devise of the said Land to my son Ambrose.

Item I do hereby direct and subject the lands I have here given and devised to my sons, to the use of my well belov'd wife Nelly, to work such of her slaves or servants on as she may or shall choose, during her widowhood without paying any rent for the same, except a reasonable proportion of the legal tax that shall be on the said devised tract at the time she shall occupy the same, and also a like proportion of the necessary buildings and repairs for her emolument. And I also direct and subject the said lands to the use of my daughters Sarah and Frances Taylor Madison to work their slaves or servants on until ^{their} either of them shall marry and no longer, except to furnish that year's crop; the unmarried one to continue to enjoy the use of the said lands until she shall marry and either of them to be subject to pay only a reasonable proportion of legal tax that shall be on the said devised tract at the time she shall occupy the same and also a like proportion of the necessary repairs and buildings for her emolument. It is nevertheless my intention and Will that the slaves or servants of my two ^{said} Daughters shall not work solely upon any one of my sons Lands but upon each of them in a reasonable and convenient proportion to their number; and that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prohibit my sons from cultivating also the lands I have devised to them, in common with their mother and sisters while they are entitled to the use of them. It is also my Will and desire that my wife shall continue to possess and enjoy my mansion house and all the necessary houses, gardens, and yards appertaining thereto, with the accustomed liberty of getting timber and wood for the use of the said plantation and houses without waste, during Widowhood, if she chooses to live in it. I also give to my said wife for the use of her and my family all the provision and liquor which I may have on hand at the time of my death to be used at her discretion, if she be living at the time, if not, then to be divided with my other estate as hereafter directed. I also desire and it is my Will, that my said wife shall have what grain she has ground at my Will to be toll free during her Widowhood.

Item I do hereby direct and empower my executors hereafter named to pay all my debts that I shall owe at my Death, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Item I give and devise to my sons James and Ambrose my tract of Land in Louisiana County containing two hundred and nineteen acres more or less as tenants in common and the like to my

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Item Whereas I have obtained a grant for two thousand Acres of Land
lying in the County of Fayette bearing date the thirtieth day of May
one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, one moiety of which a
certain James McMullen is entitled to for his trouble in looking out
and locating the same; and as there is no division and conveyance made
to the said James McMullen I do hereby empower and direct my
Executors hereafter named to make an equal division with the
said McMullen his heirs or assigns of the said tract of Land and
to make him a sure and safe conveyance for the same if it is not
done in my life time.

Item And Whereas I have also obtained three other Grants or patents for
Lands lying in the County of Jefferson on Clover Creek a branch of
the Ohio River, one for five hundred Acres, and two others for two hundred
Acres each, and have also obtained as assignee of Thomas Fitzgerald's
warrant from the Land Office for fifty acres of Land for Military service
performed by him; and also two other warrants from the said office for
fifty acres of Land each, on importation rights as assignee of Martha
Stalon Easton Mathews; which said Nine hundred Acres of Land and also
the lands which are or may be located by virtue of the said Warrants
or in case of their being unlocated, the Warrants them selves, I give and devise unto
my three Daughters Nelly Hale, Sarah and Francis Taylor Madison and their
heirs for ever, as tenants in common to be equally divided amongst them
provided nevertheless that if either of my said daughters should die without
issue of her Body, my Will and desire is that then her or their parts
shall go to the survivors or survivor of them and their or her heirs
for ever.

Item And Whereas I have entered into an agreement with Col. James
Barbour of the County of Culpeper and Maj. William Moore and
Col. Thomas Barbour of the County of Orange to locate and sur-
vey Forty Thousand acres of Land under Treasury Rights in Partnership;
which Rights were obtained from the Land Office for ten Thousand acres in
each of our names and has been surveyed accordingly on Panther Creek
a branch of Green River in the district of Kentucky, but Lawsuits being
entered there against grants issuing for twenty thousand acres of
the said Lands surveyed on the name of the said William

Moore and my self, each survey containing ten thousand Acres: and
a dispute arising between the aforesaid James Barbour and Thomas
Barbour with Col George Mason and they the said James and Thomas
Barbour having entered Caveats against some of the said George Mason's
surveys on the said Panther Creek, one fourth of the said lands which are
or may be recovered or obtained by virtue of the said surveys on the said
Panther Creek, or Warrants after deducting one six tenth part which
may be due, or allotted to the agent employed to search for and locate
the same will be my property, which I give and dispose of as followeth to
wit: I give and devise to my son Francis and his heirs for ever and do
hereby confirm the right and title to him for one tenth part of my
property of the said lands for which he furnished warrants provided
he or his heirs or assigns pays one tenth part of the charges and expenses which
has or shall accrue in obtaining grants for the same and every other inci-
dental cost and expence. Item I also give and devise all the residue of the said
lands that I am entitled to or have any interest or claim to by virtue of
the said surveys or Warrants to my four sons James, Francis, Ambrose and
William, and to their heirs for ever as tenants in common; and I also give
and devise all other lands that I may have any right title or claim to
or interest in, either in my own right or ^{with} any other person or persons what-
soever not hereby before devised, unto my said four sons and their heirs
for ever.

Item I do hereby confirm to my son James a good right and title to the
following slaves which I have heretofore given him, to wit. Billy which
he has since sold, Lucy, Simeon and her children Dinah, Alice, Minny, Stephen-
ander, John and Amey, and their future increase forever. And I do also con-
firm to my son Francis a good right and title to the following slaves
which I have heretofore given him, to wit, Gideon, Aaron, Hannah, Tell
and her son George, and Amy who is to be estimated as a grown woman
and their increase since the first day of January 1773, and for the future,
and also the servitude of an indentured Mulatto Woman named Sarah Madam
and her children.

And I do also confirm to my son Ambrose a good right and title to the fol-
lowing slaves to wit, Jacob, John, Celia, and her Children Savener, whom
he hath since sold, Betty, Beck and Caesar (Isaac a man, Catherine a woman
since dead) and their future increase forever; also the increase of the said
Celia since the first day of January 1780. And I also confirm to

son William a good right and title to the following slaves to Wm. Nathan
 Margaret & her Child Henry and her future increase for ever. And I do also
 conform to my daughter Nelly Hale the following Slaves to wit, Jerry,
 Jemmy, Sally, Nelly, & Eliza and her Children Joanna, Gianna, Dennis
 Under an Webster, also True love, and her Children, Peggy, Prescilla,
 Henry and Katy, and their increase since the first day of March 1753
 and for the future. And it is my Will and desire that such of my children
 to whom I have advanced or shall hereafter in my lifetime advance any
 slaves or other part of my personal Estate not hereby disposed of, shall
 have as much more of what I shall possess at my death after my
 debts if I shall owe any, and my funeral expenses are paid, as will make
 them nearly equal in share and share alike with my wife, if she
 survives me and my other children as circumstances will with con-
 venience admit.

I Item all the residue of my personal Estate ^{and} not hereby before
 given, or advanced to any of my children, I give and bequeath to my
 loving wife Nelly, if she survives me and all my children forever, to
 be equally divided among them, except one half of my house
 hold and Kitchen furniture which I give and bequeath to my loving
 wife Nelly for her part forever which with the other bequests, pre-
 vileges and benefits, I give to her in lieu of her dower, except also my
 Cabinet, Clock, Turkey Carpet, Maps and pictures which I desire
 may continue in and belong to my Mansion House, so that those
 who have not been advanced in my life time shall have an equal
 share with those who have; And it is my Will and desire that my said
 wife shall have in her lot such of my house servants
 or slaves as she shall chuse, and also my tradesman Harry if she
 chuses to take him; and I desire my Blacksmith Moses may belong to
 such of my children as he shall chuse to serve if they are willing
 to take him at a reasonable price that shall be set on him
 him by three disinterested Men. And I do appoint my executors here-
 after named guardians to my daughter Francis Taylor Madison
 during her minority, and empower them to sell or otherwise
 dispose of such of her slaves as they shall suspect may be in danger
 of being lost by running away and not recovered again.

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Item I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my four sons James, Francis, Ambrose and William Executors of this my — will; and do hereby direct that my Estate shall not be appraised. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of September 1797.

At a Court held for Orange County at the Courthouse on Monday the twenty seventh day of April 1801 This last Will and Testament of James Madison deceased was proved by the oaths of Robert Atcock and Andrew Shepherd witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded.

And at another Court held in the said County at the Courthouse aforesaid, on Monday the twenty seventh day of July following On the Motion of William Madison one of the Executors named in the said Will, who made oath thereto according to Law, and together with Thomas Richards, John Moore and Robert T. Moore his Sureties entered into, and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of fifty thousand Dollars, conditioned as the Law directs.

Certificate was granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form liberty being reserved to James Madison the other surviving Executor named in the said Will, to join in the probat when he shall think fit.
