and the heirs of her body but if no heirs to return as directed by the Will of
Benjamin Price deceased.

7. I give unto my Daughter Lucy Barbours Moore my Tract or parcel of Land whereon
I now live which is to contain One hundred and fifty Acres to her and the heirs
of her body but if she should die without such heirs to be divided hereafter mentioned.
