Make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in the following Manner & form first
I Recommend my Soul to God that gave it & my Body to be Buried in a Christian like
Manner and to what Worldly Goods it hath pleased God to bestow me With in this
Life I give and Bequeath & dispose of in in Manner & form following on & with the
Conditions & with such Reservations as hereafter mentioned I Impower & Lend unto
my Well beloved Sister Anne Finell the wife of Tho^s Finell during her natural
Life my Negro Manch named Martha & one Negro girl named Esther & at her decease
my Will & Desire is the same named Negro Martha & Esther with their Increase
be Equally Divided among all the Children of my said Sister Anne Finell

Then I give and Bequeath unto my well beloved Cousin Benoni Hamford one
Negro Girl named Judy to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for
ever but if he should die Benoni Hamford should die without lawful issue of
his body then I give the above named Negro Judy to my well beloved Cousin
John Carter the Daughter of Nicholas Carter to her heirs forever

Lastly I do make constitute and appoint My well beloved Brother
Nicholas Carter Whate and sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament
and I do hereby absolutely Renounce & declare Ratifying & Confirming
This to be my Last Will and Testament In Witnes whereof
I have set my hand and seal the Day & year first above Written
