four I Daniel McManagham of the County of Augusta in the Colony
of Virginia Governor, Am very sick and weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory praise be therefor given to Almighty
God Do make and contain the very present Last will and Testament
in words and form following that is to say, first and principally
I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the
merits Death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have fully
free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to be happy in everlasting
life and for my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
Christian like and decent manner as the Divine service of my Saviour
hereafter named nothing doubting but that at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mercy of God for some touching
and worldly estate I have not had any part thereof in this life

I give, devise and dispose of the house in the following manner, from
first I will that my said debts and funeral charges shall be paid, paid
and discharged and that all my goods and chattels be sold in full
various or otherwise for and towards the payment of the said debts and
charges and the remainder of my be shall be for the use of my well
beloved daughter Mary & her heirs forever to the maintenance
and schooling her in her & her only ^{and} shall be care and
expense to my said daughter all and singular my lands and tenements
freely to be enjoyed by her and her heirs forever but if my
daughter shall die in this life before she shall attain to the years of
one and twenty then in such case the leasing or legittimate issue
of me that my lands and tenements shall be sold and the money
arising thereby with the other money must be divided one half for
the use of the church and the other of the church of which she shall be a
legal resident at the time of her death and the other half to my
said daughter to possess any residue of the money of my said
goods that she was born the twenty 2 of the day of December in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty two 1742
and I hereby constitute, do give and give my well beloved daughter
