

On the 2nd of October the 15th year of King Edward  
year four hundred & six thousand three hundred & twenty five  
the 2nd day of August in the County of Margam being then  
a Wednesday last past & now deceased & buried from  
yester day to this morning & lying in state in the Chapel of St. Peter  
and having it prepared for his interment in the church of St. Peter  
in Margam and there was then made a speech by the Vicar of Margam  
of all the grace and commandments given us the hand of God before  
the body of the deceased was carried to the church  
wherein like and divers Masses at the direction of his Lord  
not thinking but the general Resurrection of the dead  
was properly the time of his death & he did not expect  
so shortly before he had been buried to have been the  
last degree of his life & dying of the last sickness of Margam

I hope to be back home in about a month
