purchased of George Home to him and his heirs forever. I'm I give and bequeath
unto the same John Gray when he shall come to be of the age of Twenty one Years
One saddle horse saddle and bridle one Cart horse two Cows and Calves one
feather bed and furniture one Iron pot one dozen pickers plates three dishes
one frying pan and to be found dress & bedding clothing during his Infancy
I'm I lend unto my loving wife Catherine all the rest of my Estate both
Real and personal of what kind or Nature soever and wheresoever it be
for and during the Term of her Natural life and from and after her decease
I Will and decree and bequeath the same unto the said John Gray and Do
herby constitute and appoint my loving and lawfull wife Catherine to be
my whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament Revoking
all other and former Wills by me made declaring this only to be my last
Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this Tenth day of January anno Domini one thousand seven hundred
and forty seven Eight. Signed and sealed and Published in the presence
of us who subscribed our Names and I desire that not any of my Estate
shall be sold

Writing bearing different dates one the Twenty first day of November the other the Tenth day
of January last past the first signed the other not signed, said to contain the last Will &
Testament of John Tomlinson Gent. dec. were presented unto Court by Catherine Tomlinson the
Executrix therein named which being seen the Court is of opinion that the writing bearing
date the 10th day of January is the last Will of the said John Tomlinson & it is ordered that
the Sheriff make proclamation that up & after according to Law that the heirs at Law may

Hue and on the Motion of the said Executors who made oath according to
