Court of Probate and my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner with the  
Christianity of my Poor soul hereafter mentioned and according to the custom  
of Estate with which it hath been pleased God to bless me with above and  
Begone in manner as followeth.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Anne should she have the tent of falling Estate  
during her natural life my lawful debts being first paid and after her decease  
to be divided as follows.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Mallory Esq. £1000 Pounds  
and a yearly rent charge of £100 Pounds to be paid to him or his  
successors in the same manner.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Mallory £1000 Pounds  
and a yearly rent charge of £100 Pounds to be paid to her or her  
successors in the same manner.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Mallory his Son and all his  
descendants of him, all his lands and tenements hereditaments

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Mallory his Son and all his  
descendants of him, all his lands and tenements hereditaments

Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Mallory, Batt and wife together with his  
heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Nathan Mallory, his Son, Negro man named  
Joshua and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son August Mallory, his Son, Negro man named  
John and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Nathan Mallory, his Son, Negro man named  
John and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Collings one negro girl  
named Nancy, to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Smith one negro girl named  
Betty, to her and her heirs forever

have all the stock consisting in fifteen head of cattle & hogs And also all my  
household furniture.

This last Will and Testament of John Mallory deceased was presented unto Court by

the presence of William Smith one of the witnesses thereto & ordered to  
be Recorded & on the motion of the said Executors who made application accordingly  
a law Certificate is granted them for affixing the same to the record office  
whereupon they will take James Palmer Notary Publick & Roger Mallory  
Chandler their bond for the sum of one Thousand pounds being  
delivered.
