In the name of God Amen I Joseph Lee of the County of Orange in the Parish being in perfect Sense and Memory Blessed be God for the same do make this my last Will and Testament first I give my soul to Almighty God who gave it me & my Body to the Earth to be Decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named
Then I lend to my Beloved wife all my Estate Both Real and Personal during her natural life or whilst she remains a Widow And in Case she should Marry it is my Will and desire that she shall keep my negro man Jack and my Negro woman Lucy and all my Household furniture and the best Horse that I have and her Saddle during her Life and if she should Marry it is then my desire that the rest of my Estate besides what I have Lent to my Beloved Wife being sold and Equally divided Between my three sons Thomas John & George and my daughter Sarah when George be paying to his two Brothers and Sister each two Eleven Pound Six Shillings and Eight pence a piece in Consideration of a negro boy that George Lee has had out of my Estate already And it is my desire that my son George Lee do have my Will

Now I give to my son Joseph Eve Deceased two daughters Betty Eve & Sarah Eve
Ten Pounds a piece to be paid them at my Beloved Wife's Decease it is my desire in
case my ~~Beloved~~ Wife should Marry that at her decease that what I have Lent
her be divided in the form and manner of my other Estate Between my three
sons John Eve & Thomas Eve & George Eve & my Daughter Sarah Eve and it is
my Desire that my Daughter Sarah Eve do keep the bed and furniture that she now
has and likewise it is my Desire that my son Thomas Eve doth have a bed furniture
Before the Estate is Divided. Lastly I do appoint my Beloved Wife Executors
and my son George Eve and my Friend Johnny Scott my Executors to this my
last Will and Testament Revoking all other former Will by me made Witness my
hand and Seal this 2nd day of January 1770
