Item Whereas I have been inform'd that the Negro & other Estate
left me by my beloved Husband are at my disposal, and as I
am desirous too will should be complied with. Therefore to prevent

any contests or disputes that might arise it is my Will & desire
that all the Negro & other personal Estate left me by my husband
and all that I am possessed with be divided in the Manner

herein set forth in this Will & that my Executors shall

And lastly I do appoint my Sons Zachary Taylor Geo. Taylor &
Erasmus Taylor Executors, hereby revoking all other Wills by me
